

111th U.S. House of Representatives Voting Records

- 1. H Res 1092 - Columbia Trade “Fast Track”**
The House agreed to a bill that would suspend ‘fast track’ considerations of the Columbia Free Trade Agreement, prolonging the treaty process. Roll Call 181.
Passed 224-195, April 10, 2008, Farm Bureau favored a “No”.
- 2. HR 2419 - Farm Bill/Payment Limits**
The House defeated a motion to instruct conferees to agree to a \$40,000 per person limit for annual direct payments. Roll Call 238.
Rejected 157-259, May 1, 2008, Farm Bureau favored a “No”.
- 3. HR 2419 - Farm Bill/Conference Report**
The House agreed to final passage of the 2008 Farm Bill providing for crop programs, conservation, rural development and agricultural trade. Roll Call 315.
Passed 218-15, May 14, 2008, Farm Bureau favored a “Yes”.
- 4. HR 6124 - Farm Bill/Veto Override**
The House agreed to override President Bush’s veto of the Farm Bill. Roll Call 417.
Passed 317-109, June 18, 2008, Farm Bureau favored a “Yes”.
- 5. HR 7060 - Tax Extensions/Passage**
The House agreed to a bill that would have extended state and local sales tax deductions, and provide tax incentive for renewable energy production. The bill contained Energy Tax Incentives, Disaster Tax Incentives, Alternative Minimum Tax delay, and Unrelated Business Income Tax (UBIT) provisions. Roll Call 649.
Passed 257-166, September 26, 2008, Farm Bureau favored a “Yes”.
- 6. HR 2454 – Cap and Trade Legislation/Passage**
The House agreed to the Waxman/Markey bill that would create a cap-and-trade system to limit greenhouse gas emissions. The bill would greatly reduce available energy resources and increase costs for producers. Roll Call 477.
Passed 219-212, June 26, 2009, Farm Bureau favored a “No”.
- 7. HR 2997 - Agriculture Appropriations/Conference Report**
The House agreed to the Conference Report making \$121 billion in appropriations for agriculture related agencies and programs. Roll Call 761.
Passed 263-162, October 7, 2009, Farm Bureau favored a “Yes”.
- 8. HR 3962 – Health Care, Passage**
The House agreed to the bill that would significantly alter health insurance programs, including providing a government run ‘public-option’. Roll Call 887.
Passed 220-215, November 7, 2009, Farm Bureau favored a “No”.
